





Tenant RTC (a brief intro)

A **right to counsel for tenants** is a law that establishes a government-funded guarantee of legal representation *in eviction* cases and other proceedings as may be set out in the law.

RTC is **one of numerous** critical interventions necessary to keep more tenants (our neighbors) stably housed.



Tenant Outcomes in RTC Jurisdictions

New York City

In cases (eviction and NYCHA termination) with reported resolutions, 84% of households represented in court by lawyers were able to remain in their homes (FY'23 OCJ Evaluation of UAC)

In past evals: decrease in filing rates, decreased default rates.

Connecticut

In 2023, CT-RTC providers helped clients achieve 64% of all clients' case goals (CT-RTC Evaluation by Stout Jan 2022-Nov. 2023)

"...lawyers are able to help tenants stay in their homes when it is likely that they would otherwise have been evicted" (CT-RTC Qualitative Evaluation, 2023)

"...CT-RTC was able to help negotiate exits that both minimized adverse impacts for tenants and ensured the timely return of property to its owner." (CT-RTC Qualitative Evaluation, 2023)

Tenant RTC movement so far...

- 22 RTC jurisdictions
- Due in large part to powerful tenant organizing movement around the country

RTC and Racial & Health Justice

- Evictions jeopardize several of the vital conditions needed for people & communities to thrive:
 - Safe and stable housing, employment and financial security, education, access to healthcare, and social connection
- Adults and children who have been evicted are more likely to experience negative health outcomes.
- The threat of eviction establishes a power imbalance from the start of the landlord-tenant relationship, deterring people who rent their homes from seeking to enforce their housing rights.

RTC and Racial & Health Justice

- Black renters, especially Black women living with children, are at the greatest risk of having an eviction filed against them.
 - Between 2007 and 2016, approx. 1 in 5 Black renters had an eviction case filed against their household, compared to 1 in 24 White renters. (Graetz et al., 2023)
- Black and Latine households are more likely to live in unhealthy housing.
- People with disabilities, LGBTQIA+ individuals, and people with low incomes are also disproportionately impacted by housing insecurity.

RTC and Racial & Health justice

Eviction cases involve the application of a complex set of federal, state, and local laws and move fast.

But on average **only 3%** of tenants in eviction cases have an attorney (as compared to 83% of landlords).

RTC has the potential to redress inequities in health, housing stability, housing quality, and tenant-landlord power by helping to:

- Keep tenants stably housed
- Identify and address unhealthy housing conditions
- Empower tenants to exercise their rights and work together to advocate for additional protections


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
